	 following adoption of the master plan and it would provide detailed design of new facilities and their locations. There had been discussions with stakeholders and all the aviation services would shift, the goal being to separate fixed wing from rotary wing. Building an over-run for the runway (giving an additional 240m stopping distance) was a planned infrastructural development and a major project. 	 Upper Clutha use of Queenstown Airport It was estimated that about 20-30 % of Queenstown Airport users came from the Upper Clutha. Carparking remained a challenge and QAC sought to provide reasonable options for those needing to drive to the airport. More EV charging facilities were to be installed. Options were being considered for being able to move EVs once they were charged (e.g. a valet service?) QAC was making the airport bike friendly by installing cycle facilities for staff and enabling airport users to bike into town. 	
	QAC involvement in Wānaka Airport and NASA sublease Members noted some frustration within the Upper Clutha community about Queenstown Airport's management of Wānaka Airport, particularly the lack of clarity about revenue including NASA leases. Often the reluctance of Queenstown Airport to share
